

Crozet Streetscape Completion FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who will maintain and remove trash from the new trash receptacles?

The County of Albemarle General Services Department will maintain the receptacles and contract for trash removal.

Who will maintain the street lights?

The County of Albemarle General Services Department will maintain the street lights.

Who will maintain the benches?

The County of Albemarle General Services Department will maintain the benches.

Who will maintain the sidewalk?

VDOT will maintain the sidewalks.

Who is responsible for snow and ice removal from the sidewalk?

Property owners are responsible for snow and ice removal from the sidewalks in front of their establishments.

Who maintains the trees and plants along the sidewalk/roadway?

The County of Albemarle General Services Department will maintain all of the landscaping, including the tree and plants.

Why are the planters so deep?

The Crozet Avenue Streetscape project includes planters that are “in-line” bio-filtration (or bio-filters) at select locations along Crozet Avenue. The bio-filter accepts stormwater run-off from the street and uses a mixture of sand, compost and topsoil (produced locally by Luck Stone) to filter pollutants from the run-off. The goal is to minimize pollutants from the road (oils/gasoline/sediment) from entering our streams and rivers within the Chesapeake Bay watershed. These bio-filters function similar to ones located around the County on private developments and at County facilities (such as the one at Western Albemarle High School and the County Office Building).

Why was the turn lane of the parking lot in front of the Post Office eliminated?

The parking lot’s curb cuts were designed to conform with VDOT’s current design standards.

Why were the street light poles sited as they are?

The street lights were sited based on required setbacks and conform with VDOT and ADA standards.

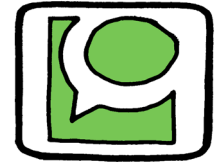
