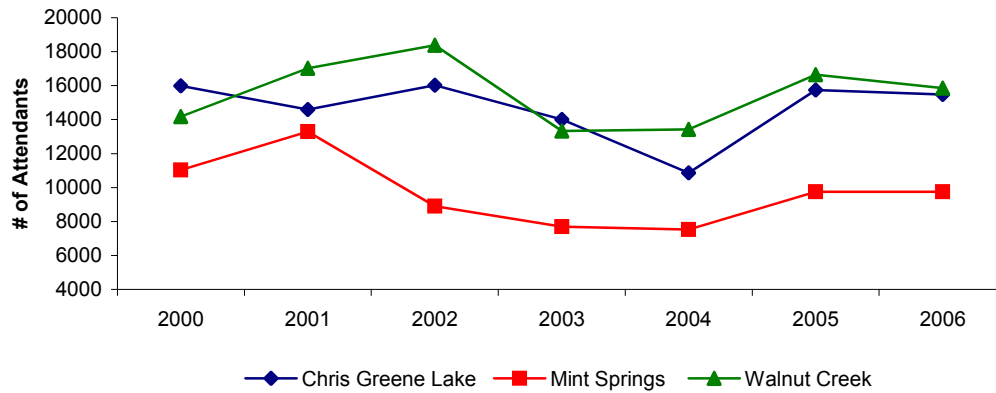

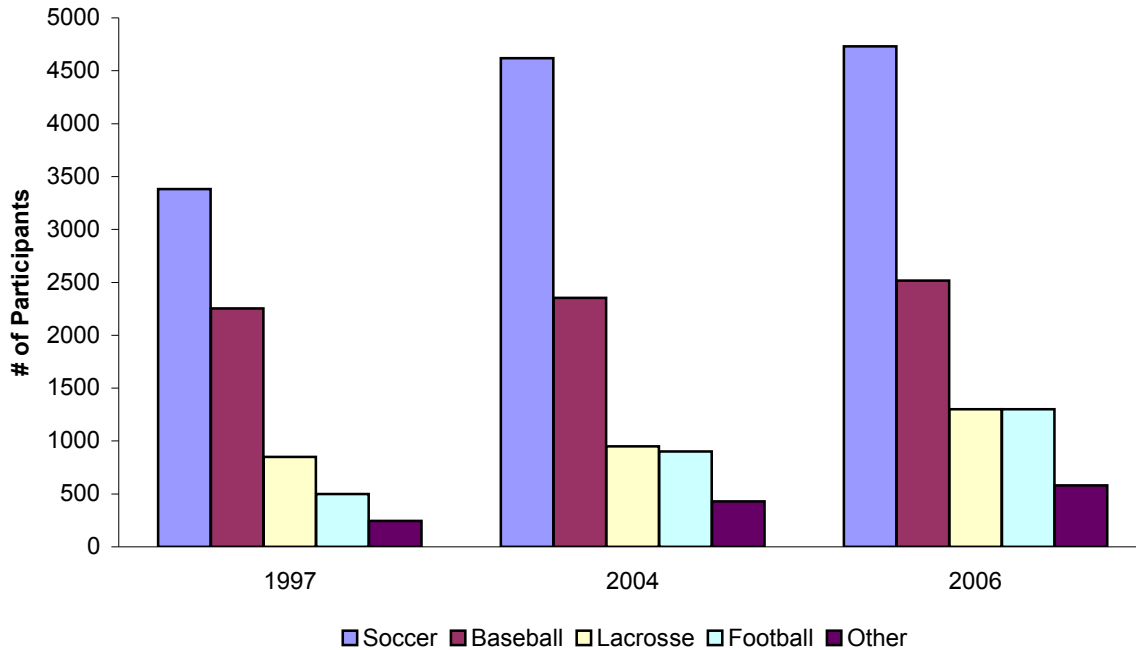

Soccer Continues to Have the Highest Number of Participants Among Athletic Programs

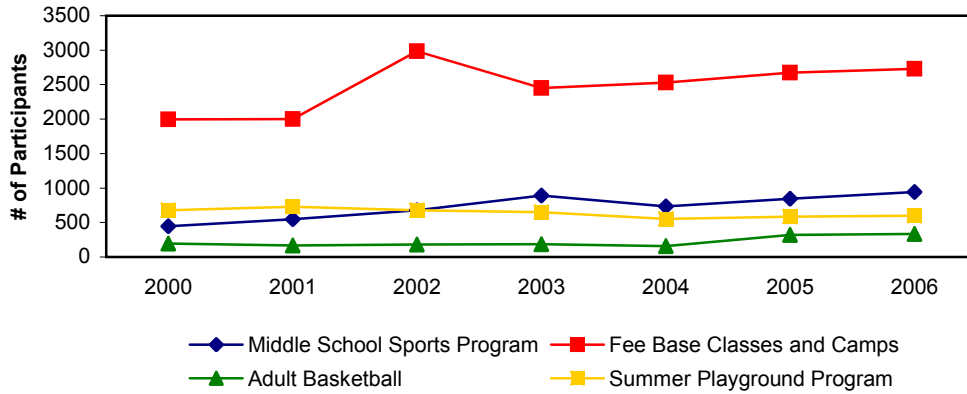
