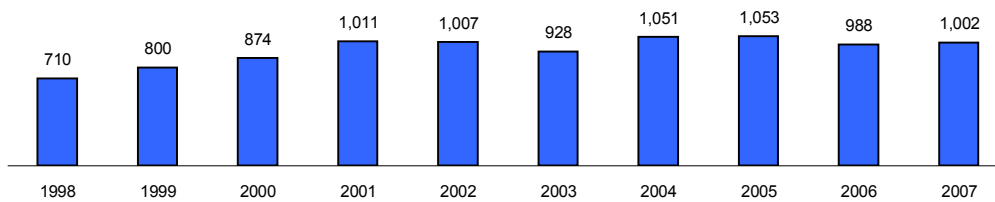


Since 2001, The Total Number of Crimes against Persons Has Hovered Around 1,000 Per Year

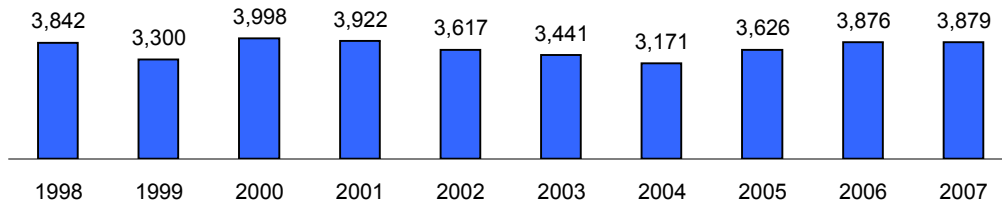


Crimes against Persons

Since the early part of the decade, the total number of crimes against persons typically has remained in a band around 1,000 per year, with no meaningful multiyear trend.

Offenses against Property Declined Substantially in the Middle of the Decade, but Have Increased Substantially Since Then



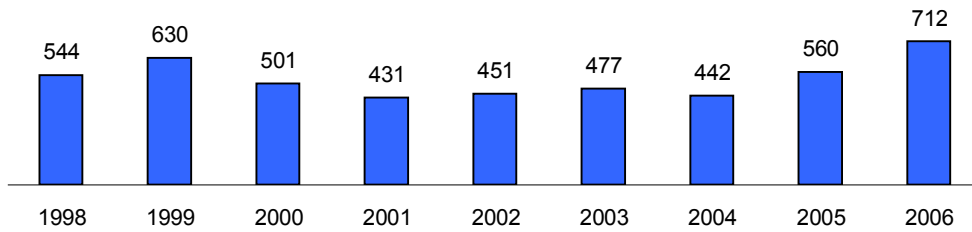
Crimes against Property

After hitting a ten year low of 3,171 in 2004, the number of offenses against property rose to 3,879 (an increase of 22.3%) by 2007. This growth in offenses against property was substantially higher than the rate of growth in population.

Number of Offenses against Society Increased between 2004 and 2006

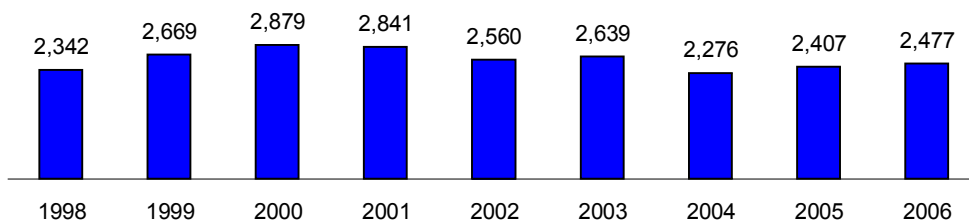


Offenses against Society

Overall, crimes against society in 2006 increased by 61.1% over 2004. This phenomenon was due mainly to increases in drug offenses and public drunkenness.

Alarm Calls Increased in 2006



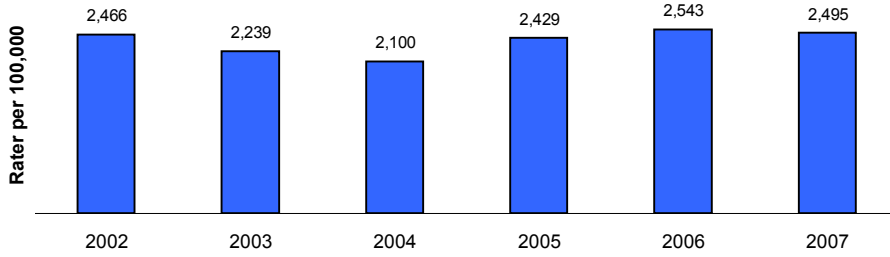
Alarm Calls

An alarm call is for an audible alarm going off (business or residence). This type of call can range from intrusion alarms, when a sensor has been tripped, to an incorrectly entered alarm code on a panel box. Alarm reports have continued to increase in 2006 with a 2.9 percentage change over the previous year.

Crime Rate per 100,000 Residents Increased between 2004 and 2007



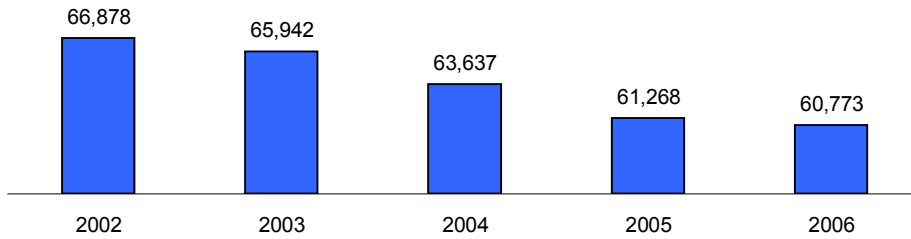
Crime Rate per 100,000

Calls for Service

A new procedure was instituted, in 2002, to calculate calls for service utilizing Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD). A call for service is any call that requires a Police presence in any way (an actual police response, a phone call to victim, a note for an ofcr to update a past call, etc). Calls for service decreased in 2006 by 0.8%, leading to four consecutive years of declines in the number of calls.

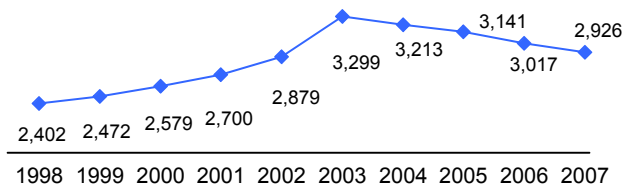

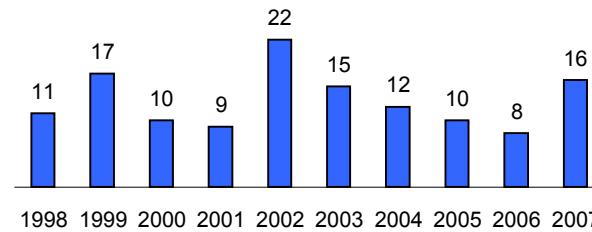
Motor Vehicle Reports

Since 2003, auto accidents have decline; fatalities were declining between 2002 and 2006 but nearly doubled in 2007. The number of summonses increased dramatically, by 48.8%, between 2005 and 2007. DUI's had decreased between 1998 and 2003, but have since jumped by 46.8%.

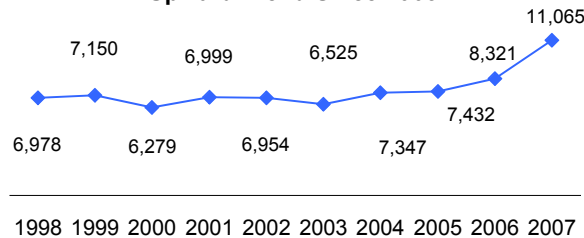
Auto Accidents Have Experienced a Downward Trend Since 2003



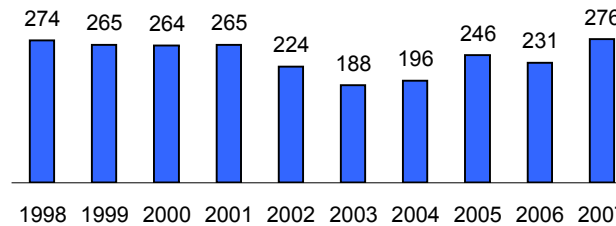
Motor Vehicle Accident Fatalities Jumped in 2007

Driving Under the Influence Has Increased Significantly in Recent Years

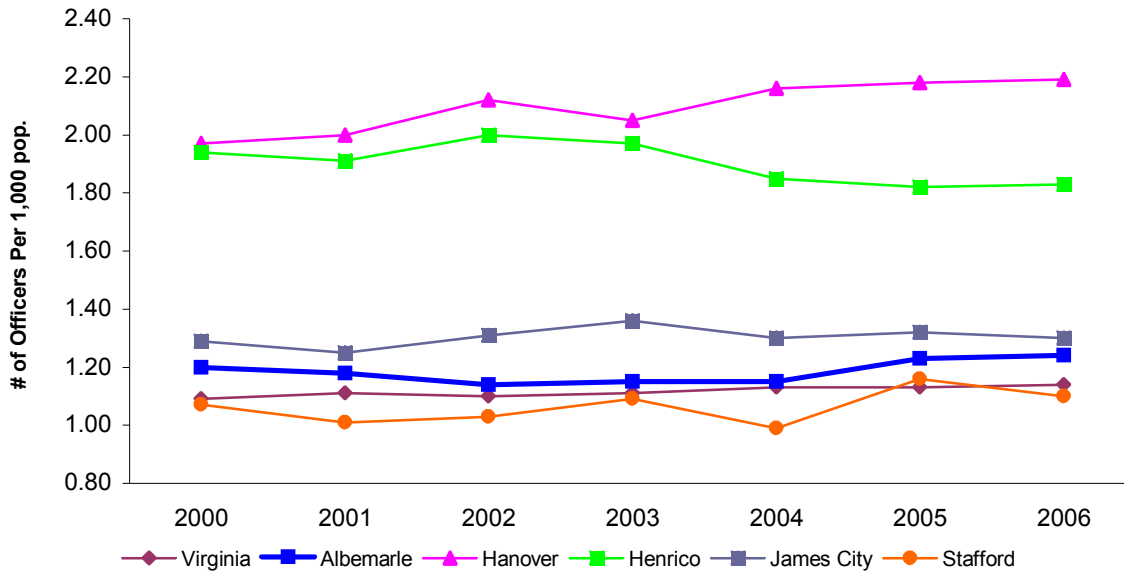

Albemarle Continues to Have the Second Lowest Number of Officers per 1,000 Population Among Peer Counties

When compared to peer counties, Albemarle continues to have the second lowest number of officers per population with 1.28 officers for every 1,000 persons among peer counties. Albemarle does have, however, 0.10 more officers than does the State.
