

Criteria For Home Electronic Incarceration

1. Sentenced to no more than 2 years total time.
2. Sentence must be resolved by the court.
3. No sentence can include [Pre] or [Post] release programs.
4. Record must be clear of all pending charges, outstanding warrants and detainers.
Inmates bonded on current charges will be handled on a case by case basis.
5. Must have in writing the approval of each sentencing court.
6. Must agree to abide by all program rules and regulations.
7. Must agree in writing to release any and all information concerning the inmate's past or current history, criminal history, employment history, educational history and health records history to the Work Release department.
8. Must **LIVE** within a 35-mile radius of the jail and if working be **EMPLOYED** within a 35-mile radius of the jail, Nelson county inmates will be handled on a case by case basis.
9. Must not have an extensive criminal history.
10. Must not be convicted of the following charges:
 - A. Any sexual related offenses.
 - B. Abduction or kidnapping offenses.
 - C. Child related sex crimes.
 - D. Violent or brutal crimes.
 - E. Crime involving the use of a weapon.
 - F. Involvement in organized crime.
 - G. Escape or attempted escape from an institution or custody
 - H. Crime for the **DISTRIBUTION** of any drugs.
 - I. Crimes showing a history or pattern of assaultive behavior.
 - J. No domestic assaults within the last [5] five years.
 - K. No more than [2] two [FTA] Failures to appear convictions within the past year.
 - L. Parole violation.
 - M. Fugitive from justice.
11. People who have a **Current history of** or are **current taking** any psychotropic medications will be reviewed and handled on a case by case basis.

12. Any inmate **TESTING POSITIVE** to their initial drug-screening test prior to being placed onto the Home Electronic Monitoring program **WILL NOT** be allowed to participate in the program.
13. Upon the inmate's passing the initial urinalysis screening, the inmate must agree to submit to random **Alcohol Sensor, Urinalysis** or **Blood** test as directed by jail staff while on the Home Electronic Monitoring program. The inmate will be held accountable for the cost of each test. If the test results come back positive for any illegal or unauthorized substance, the inmate will be held and returned to the facility, disciplinary action will be taken and the inmate will be removed from the Home Electronic Monitoring program. If, at that time, the inmate would like secondary testing, the inmate must notify the officer as soon as the test results are known. The inmate will be held liable for all cost associated with the request for secondary testing.
14. If the inmate fails to give a urinalysis upon request, they will be returned to the jail and held until one is taken from them. If they refuse to give one, they will be removed from the program.
15. If employed the inmate will work no more than Six days a week, Ten hours a day.
16. If employed the inmate is not allowed to work overtime or other hours not prearranged with the Work Release department. Unless the inmates supervisor contacts and receives authorization from the Work Release department
17. The employer must meet the guidelines and criteria as set by the Work Release department:
 1. Have a business license – {if a business license is not required in the business jurisdiction, a written waiver for exemption must be submitted to the work release department}.
 2. Have workman's compensation insurance.
 3. Abide by all the Guidelines and Responsibilities for Employers as set by the work release program.
18. Stationary employment is highly recommended. **[If Employment is not stationary the employer must make provisions for daily notification to the Work Release department prior to the inmate moving to a new job site].**
19. All paperwork required by the Work Release department must be turned in to the Work Release department prior to being submitted to the ICC.
20. Upon approval for the HEM program you will be required to make an initial deposit, depending on the type of monitoring equipment used, prior to you going onto the program. \$10.00 of this deposit will go towards your initial urinalysis screening and

the remaining balance will remain on your account. **Only** Money orders or Cashiers checks will be accepted for your initial deposit. Note: Your account balance, **WILL NEVER**, go below your initial deposit, if it does you will be subject to removal from the program. Upon completion of the program any unused funds will be reimbursed too you.

21. Inmates will pay \$25.00 per week towards fines and court cost as required by court order. If this money is not paid, you will be removed from the Work Release program.
22. Any inmate who has been found guilty of (1) Major Rule Violation or two (2) or more Minor Rule Violations during their present confinement will not be eligible for the “A” or “B” custody Inmate Workforce for a period of 90 days from the date of their last conviction.
23. The Work Release Department, Classification Department or Administration of this jail, reserves the right to remove any inmate from the Work Release or HEM Program they feel are not complying with the rules and regulations of the facility or program.
24. The inmate has the right to appeal any decision of the ICC to the Superintendent within [2] two working days of the ICC decision.

Only inmates who meet the eligibility requirements as outlined above will be considered for review by the Institutional Classification Committee, (ICC).
